Sandy Mackie's second season at the helm was also quite successful; losing only once in regular season play (8-1-3). That made for only three regular season losses in two years. The Ravens were again ranked as high as # 2 nationally, but finished the season #5 with only one loss, a second OUAA East first place showing and again a home playoff game. Expectations were high and with Lauter, Cochrane, Van Heerden and Zaborski anchoring the back and veterans all through the line-up, it was warranted.



Queens came to town for the first round of the OUA East playoffs and after a 0-0 draw through regulation, the Ravens would eventually lose on penalties (Marty Lauter's penalty seemingly crossing the line, given, then not given) and Queens advanced.



Marty Lauter had come back for a final year of eligibility after a four year hiatus. Most of "the crop" remained form 1992, but lost Greg Gallo for a year and Escobar, who would not return. A 39 year old rookie named John Louro (former Angolan International) and Chris Scucatto, were also added to this team along with returning players Jeff Knight, Joe Gabor, Marc Baumgartner, Julian Carr, and Laurentian transfer Les Walden. Steve Ball, Frank De Caria, and Jason Ringhoffer were the goalkeepers. Only two *true* rookies played this season – Rob Norcross and Marty McCaffery





This was also the final year for award winning veterans Basil Phillips, Andre Van Heerden, Earl Cochrane, David Rowntree and Marty Lauter – A sad way to go out. Basil Phillips scored 10 goals this season and was selected as an OUA All Star along with Cochrane and Wooldridge.
