The CIS also awarded two Ravens an All-Canadian nod in 2007: Roberto Gutierrez, a fourth year defender from Ottawa, Ontario, was named to the First Team and Kofi Ilboudo, a third year Striker from Ottawa, Ontario, was named to the Second Team.
