It was another potential Nationals hangover year, but the boys were determined to return and understood that peaking at the right time would be the key.

Sam McHugh, in his second season with the team, recalls:

2009 was a rough year. We lost a ton of graduating players from last year's team plus Nick Persichino had to miss the year through injury and Karl Wasslen got a concussion in a pre-season game that made him miss most of the regular season as well. Luckily this was Joey's (Kewin) rookie year which helped a lot. I think we finished the regular season around .500 but we began coming together around playoff time. I remember we needed overtime to beat Nipissing in the first round of playoff and then beat Queens in a shootout in the quarters in Kingston. We ended losing to McMaster in the Final Fours and then to Western in the bronze medal games, both in shootouts and both after scoreless games. When Karl returned we went on a crazy streak of over 3 extra-time playoff games without letting in a goal. Unfortunately, though we couldn't score either.

The Carleton Ravens would close out an up-and-down 2009 OUA East regular season campaign with a highlight 4-1 victory over their Kingston rivals, the No. 10 nationally-ranked Queen's Gaels (8-2-4).
