The team would give up a record low 5 goals against during the regular season; a 14-game regular season, no less. The 10-game season record is 4 goals against set by the 2005 OUA Champion Ravens. The 12-game record is held by Sandy's first team in 1992, with 6 goals against.





The Ravens would enter the playoffs ranked 10th in Canada after a second place finish in the OUA East. Unfortunately for this talented Raven side, the Ryerson Rams had their number and narrowly defeated the second-seeded Carleton Ravens 3-2 on a Saturday afternoon at Ravens' Field in Ottawa. Player-coach Kevin Souter scored two goals and Alex Braletic added one as the Rams came back from being down 2-0 in the second half. The win marked the first time that the Ryerson men's soccer team has reached the OUA semi-finals and re-established a long standing rivalry between the two clubs.

The game was also a chance for Ryerson to extract some revenge on Carleton, who ousted the Rams 4-0 two years ago in the quarter-finals. Seven players from that Ravens squad took part in Saturday's game as well as four Rams. Joey Kewin and Jonni Okai scored for Carleton and three other players were issued yellow cards. Carleton keeper Karl Wasslen had nine shutouts on the season, but the Ravens would end the year with another tough loss.









Karl Wasslen (Ottawa, Ont.) – fifth-year goalkeeper for the Carleton Ravens was named to the First-Team All-Star list for the third time in his career. He recorded a record 12 shutouts this season for the Ravens. Joining Wasslen on the list was defender Nick Persichino (Thunder Bay, Ont.) along with midfielders Joey Kewin (London, Ont.) and Sam McHugh (Russell, Ont.)
