A year after going to Nationals, the Ravens would return two key offensive players in Kewin and Latty surrounded by a young core of new athletes looking to follow up on one of the most successful season in recent memory.



Last year's successful campaign saw the Carleton Ravens win an OUA silver medal and compete at the 2012 CIS soccer nationals. This year their goal was to qualify for the national championship once again. This time around the national tournament was to be held at the University of New Brunswick in Fredericton, November 7-10. The Ravens went 1-2 in three games at the last November's CIS championship in Quebec City. Carleton had to settle with a sixth place finish at Laval University.



The boys would get off to a good start, win the games they were supposed to win, and have a quality season finishing second in the OUA East. After playoff victories over, the team would stumble against a strong nationally ranked York side, 2-1in the OUA Semi Final and call it a season once again. Joey Kewin would finish his eligibility this season and Andre Latty was not set to return for a fourth season. Kewin, who was captain in his final season, would also join Latty and eight other Raven legends as the 10<sup>th</sup> All-Canadian in the history of the program.

#### October 9 - Queen's 1, Carleton 4

Thank you Joey Kewin! The Ravens fifth-year midfielder from London, Ont., was an offensive juggernaut on Wednesday night, as he provided half of Carleton's offence in their 4-1 victory over the Queen's Gaels. Kewin scored in the third minute to give the Ravens an early 1-0 lead then found the back of the net once again, roughly half an hour later to put Carleton up by a pair of goals, 2-0. The ball seemed to be following Kewin for the entire contest as he potted his eighth and ninth goals of the season for Carleton. "We (Carleton) got a great start against Queen's and gained momentum from it," said Kewin. "Tonight's win was a total team effort, we scored four times but we could have had more."



The Ravens finally showed the offensive flair that had been missing during their last couple of games. "We played well tonight, when we show up, we can play with anybody in this league," said Ravens head coach, Sandy Mackie. "Joey (Kewin) and Andrew (Latty) were solid along with Mintcho Mintchev. I'm very happy for Alex De Couvreur who scored his first goal of the year." Andrew Latty (67th) joined the scoring parade when he picked up his 8th goal of the season to give the Ravens a commanding 3-0 lead. Queen's cut into Carleton's lead with a goal to make it 3-1 but Alexandre De Couvreur (Waterloo, ON) scored on a breakaway for Carleton in the 90th minute to seal the win. The Ravens record improves to (8-2-2) and 26 points. Carleton occupy second place in the OUA East division. Queen's record slides to (5-3-2) and fourth place in the division. Ryerson are at the top of the standings with a (9-0-1) record and 28 points. Carleton and Ryerson will meet on Saturday, Oct. 19. Game time at Ravens Field is 8:00 p.m.

### CIS Top 10: OUA teams rank first in men's soccer

In **men's soccer**, the undefeated **Carleton Ravens** (4-0-1) become the third team in as many weeks to occupy the No. 1 spot in the national rankings, after the reigning CIS champ UBC Thunderbirds (3-1-0) in Week 1 and the **York Lions** (5-1-0) last Tuesday. The Ravens move up one spot in the new poll thanks to a 4-0 shutout against Trent in their lone outing of the past week, combined to York dropping a 1-0 decision to **No. 7 McMaster** on Friday night. The now second-seeded Lions rebounded on Sunday with a 4-0 victory over UOIT.

Carleton striker Andrew Latty (Ottawa, Ont.) won the 2013 Community Service award for his outstanding and tireless work in the community. Among his many activities, Latty increased his community involvement as the head of Carleton's Varsity Athletic Council and founded the Ravens Care Program, which is an after school literacy program for local youth.

In addition to winning the Community Service award, Andrew Latty headlines the four Carleton Ravens who were sent to the first all-star team in 2013. Latty, the 2012 MVP, made the first all-star team with eight goals in 14 games, helping lead the Ravens to a 8-3-3 season and a berth in the Final Four this weekend. The third-year forward makes the team for the second straight year and is joined by leading scorer Joey Kewin (London, Ont.), defender Julian Piccioli (Ottawa, Ont.) and midfielder Mintcho Mintchev (Ottawa, Ont.). Kewin is now a four-time all-star after scoring a career-high nine goals this season, while Mintchev and Piccioli received their first all-star nods.
